The CCMA has produced a field guide highlighting the region's water birds. It has been designed to assist the community in identifying local water birds and learn more about their lifecycle. The booklet has forty three birds to look out for from the common to more threatened species. The booklets have been produced for distribution to local landcare networks, local government, Parks Victoria offices, coastal foreshore committees, and other interested groups and individuals. The booklet aims to highlight the critical habitat the region's wetlands provide and the importance of managing them for conservation.
